



Over 2,2 million people displaced





- -26 Company Emergency **Committees** were developed representing 18,450 employees.
- -827 industrial **emergency brigade** members, certified by COPECO.
- -A total of 70 companies participated in the processes of socialization of risk analysis-DRR

Remarks

Not natural for Humanitarian actors Adapted to context... no recipes – opportunities Need to adapt the language

- DRR is an investment not a cost
- Mutual benefit

Complementary

- => provide additional services
- => Facilitate an early recovery
- => scale up the action

Room for improvement

Find space to integrate the private sector as a key actor

- In the Response
- In DP & DRR
- Can make the difference in building resilience communities
